


This Section consists of Contract Specific general and special conditions. The procuring agency may customize the general conditions of the contract section, in accordance with the requirements.

Invitation to Bids

Date: 26th February, 2026

Pakistan Telecommunication Authority invites electronic bids from eligible Suppliers. The objective of this initiative is to upgrade and enhance PTA's GIS application to meet evolving operational, analytical, and compliance needs. The enhanced system shall enable comprehensive visualization, analysis, and reporting of cellular infrastructure, population coverage, complaint resolution, and Quality of Service (QoS) monitoring across Pakistan, Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJ&K), and Gilgit Baltistan (GB).

The selected Vendor shall design, develop, and deploy a secure, scalable, and user-friendly GIS solution aligned with best industry practices. The system must incorporate advanced Geo analytics and Geo-AI capabilities, support integration with third-party platforms, and ensure full technology transfer to PTA.

The bidding shall be conducted in line with the Single Stage-Two Envelope procedure of the Public Procurement Rules 2004 and any Regulations, Regulatory Guides, Procurement Guidelines or Instructions issued by the Authority (from time to time), and is open to all potential bidders.

All bids must be accompanied by a Bid Securing Declaration as per format attached in Section VI (Standard Forms) of relevant bidding document. **Original Bid Securing Declaration on letter head of bidder must be provided to the office of Director (Procurement), PTA at undermentioned address.**

The original bid, properly filled in, must be submitted on EPADS on or **before 16th March 2026 at 10:30 AM**. The bids (or technical part of the bids as the case may be) will be opened on the same day at **11:00 AM** in public and in the presence of bidders' representatives who choose to attend bid opening session at the office of Director (Procurement), PTA Headquarters, F-5/1, Islamabad.

Note: In terms of Rule 48 of Public Procurement Rules, 2004 Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) is constituted for subject procurement. Grievances can be submitted via email grievance.procurement@pta.gov.pk and on EPADS at www.eprocure.gov.pk.


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
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
SECTION II: INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS (ITBs)



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A. INTRODUCTION


1. Scope of Bid	1.1	The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS) invites Bids for the Supply and Installation of the Information Systems as specified in the BDS and Section V - Technical Specifications & Schedule of Requirements . The successful Bidders will be expected to supply and install the information systems within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the BDS .
	1.2	Unless otherwise stated throughout this document definitions and interpretations shall be as prescribed in the General Conditions of the Contract (GCC).
2. Source of Funds	2.1	Source of funds is referred in Clause-2 of Invitation for Bids.
3. Eligible Bidders	3.1	<p>A Bidder may be natural person, company or firm or public or semi-public agency of Pakistan or any foreign country, or any combination of them with a formal existing agreement (on Judicial Papers) in the form of a joint venture, consortium, or association. In the case of a joint venture, consortium, or association, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract. The joint venture, consortium, or association shall nominate a Lead Member as nominated in the BDS, who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the joint venture, consortium, or association during the Bidding process, and in case of award of contract, during the execution of contract.</p> <p><i>(The limit on the number of members of JV or Consortium or Association may be prescribed in BDS, in accordance with the guidelines issued by the PPRA).</i></p>
	3.2	The appointment of Lead Member in the joint venture, consortium, or association shall be confirmed by submission of a valid Power of Attorney to the Procuring Agency.
	3.3	Verifiable copy of the agreement that forms a joint venture, consortium or association shall be required to be submitted as part of the Bid.
	3.4	Any bid submitted by the joint venture, consortium or association shall indicate the part of proposed contract to be performed by each party and each party shall be evaluated (or qualified if required) with respect to its contribution only, and the responsibilities of each party shall not be substantially altered without prior written approval of the Procuring Agency and in line with any instructions issued by the Authority.


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	3.5	The invitation for Bids is open to all prospective supplier, manufacturers or authorized agents/dealers subject to any provisions of incorporation or licensing by the respective national incorporating agency or statutory body established for that particular trade or business.
	3.6	Foreign Bidders must be locally registered with the appropriate national incorporating body or the statutory body, before participating in the national/international competitive tendering with the exception of such procurements made by the foreign missions of Pakistan. For such purpose the bidder must have to initiate the registration process before the bid submission and the necessary evidence shall be submitted to the procuring agency along with their bid, however, the final award will be subject to the complete registration process.
	3.7	<p>A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this Bidding process, if they:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) are associated or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Procuring Agency to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications and other documents to be used for the procurement of the information systems to be procured under this Invitation for Bids. b) have controlling shareholders in common; or c) receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from any of them; or d) have the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid; or e) have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the Bid of another Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Procuring Agency regarding this Bidding process; or f) submit more than one Bid in this Bidding process.
	3.8	<p>Bidders may be ineligible if --</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) he is declared bankrupt or, in the case of company or firm, insolvent; (b) payments in favor of the Bidder is suspended in accordance with the judgment of a court of law other than a judgment declaring bankruptcy and resulting (in accordance with the national laws) in the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of its property;

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		<p>(c) legal proceedings are instituted against such Bidder involving an order suspending payments and which may result, in accordance with the national laws, in a declaration of bankruptcy or in any other situation entailing the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of the property;</p> <p>(d) the Bidder is convicted, by a final judgment, of any offence involving professional conduct;</p> <p>(e) the Bidder is blacklisted and hence debarred due to involvement in corrupt and fraudulent practices, or performance failure or due to breach of bid securing declaration.</p> <p>(f) The firm, supplier and contractor is blacklisted or debarred by a foreign country, international organization, or other foreign institutions for the period defined by them.</p>
	3.9	Bidders shall provide to the Procuring Agency evidence of their eligibility, proof of compliance with the necessary legal requirements to carry out the contract effectively.
	3.10	Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility to the satisfaction of the Procuring Agency, as the Procuring Agency shall reasonably request.
	3.11	Bidders shall submit proposals relating to the nature, conditions and modalities of sub-contracting wherever the sub-contracting of any elements of the contract amounting to the more than ten (10) percent of the Bid price is envisaged.
4. Eligible Information Systems	4.1	<p>For the purposes of these Bidding Documents, the Information System means all:</p> <p>a) the required information technologies, including all information processing and communications-related hardware, software, supplies, and consumable items that the Supplier is required to supply and install under the Contract, plus all associated documentation, and all other materials and goods to be supplied, installed, integrated, and made operational (collectively called "the Goods" in some clauses of the ITB); and</p> <p>b) the related software development, transportation, insurance, installation, customization, integration, commissioning, training, technical support, maintenance, repair, and other services necessary for proper operation of the Information System to be provided by the selected Bidder and as specified in the Contract.</p>
	4.2	All Information System made up of goods and services to be supplied under the contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, and all expenditures made under the contract


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		will be limited to the supply and installation information systems. For purpose of this Bid, ineligible countries are stated in the section-4 titled as "Eligible Countries".
	4.3	For purposes of this Clause, "origin" means the place where the goods and services making Information System are produced in or supplied from. An Information System is deemed to be produced in a certain country when, in the territory of that country, through software development, manufacturing, or substantial or major assembly or integration of components, a commercially recognized product result that is substantially different in basic characteristic or in purpose or utility from its component.
	4.4	The nationality of the supplier that supplies and install the Information System shall not determine the origin of the goods.
	4.5	To establish the eligibility of the Goods and Services making Information System, Bidders shall fill the country-of-origin declarations included in the Form of Bid.
	4.6	If so required in the BDS, the Bidder shall demonstrate that it has been duly authorized for the supply and installation of Information System in Pakistan (or in respective country in case of procurement by the Pakistani Missions abroad), the Information System indicated in its Bid.
5. One Bid per Bidder	5.1	A bidder shall submit only one Bid, in the same bidding process, either individually as a Bidder or as a member in a joint venture or any similar arrangement.
	5.2	No bidder can be a sub-contractor while submitting a Bid individually or as a member of a joint venture in the same Bidding process.
	5.3	A person or a firm cannot be a sub-contractor with more than one bidder in the same bidding process.
6. Cost of Bidding	6.1	The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the Procuring Agency shall in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

However, Procuring Agency shall place both the pdf and same editable version to facilitate the bidder for filling the forms.</p>
	<p>7.5</p>	<p>The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bidding Documents. Failure to furnish all the information required in the Bidding Documents will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in the rejection of his Bid.</p>
<p>8. Clarification of Bidding Documents, Pre-Bid Meeting and Site Visit</p>	<p>8.1</p>	<p>A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents may notify the Procuring Agency in writing or in electronic form that provides record of the content of communication at the Procuring Agency's address indicated in the BDS.</p>

	8.4	Should the Procuring Agency deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITB 9 .
	8.5	If indicated in the BDS , the Bidder's designated representative is invited at the Bidder's cost to attend a pre-Bid meeting at the place, date and time mentioned in the BDS . During this pre-Bid meeting, prospective Bidders may request clarification of the schedule of requirement, the Evaluation Criteria or any other aspects of the Bidding Documents.
	8.6	Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by Bidders, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be transmitted promptly to all prospective Bidders who have obtained the Bidding Documents. Any modification to the Bidding Documents that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Bid meeting shall be made by the Procuring Agency exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to ITB 9 . Non-attendance at the pre-Bid meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of a Bidder.
	8.7	The Bidder may wish to visit and examine the site or sites of the Information System and obtain for itself, at its own responsibility and risk, all information that may be necessary for preparing the bid and entering into the Contract. The costs of visiting the site or sites shall be at the Bidder's own expense.
	8.8	The Procuring Agency will arrange for the Bidder and any of its personnel or agents to gain access to the relevant site or sites, provided that the Bidder gives the Procuring Agency adequate notice of a proposed visit of at least seven (07) days. Alternatively, the Procuring Agency may organize a site visit or site visits concurrently with the pre-bid meeting, as specified in the BDS for ITB Clause 8.5. Failure of a Bidder to make a site visit will not be a cause for its disqualification
		No site visits shall be arranged or scheduled after the deadline for the submission of the Bids and prior to the award of Contract.
9. Amendment of Bidding Documents	9.1	Before the deadline for submission of Bids, the Procuring Agency for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder or pre-bid meeting may modify the Bidding Documents by issuing addenda.
	9.2	Any addendum issued including the notice of any extension of

	13.2	The documentary evidence of the Bidder's eligibility to Bid shall establish to the satisfaction of the Procuring Agency that the Bidder, at the time of submission of its bid, is from an eligible country as defined in Section-4 titled as "Eligible Countries".
	13.3	The documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its Bid is accepted shall establish to the satisfaction of Procuring Agency that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) in the case of a Bidder offering to supply and install Information System under the contract which the Bidder did not manufacture or otherwise produce, the Bidder has been duly authorized by the Manufacturer or producer to supply and install the information system in Pakistan; b) the Bidder has the financial, technical, and supply/production capability necessary to perform the Contract, meets the qualification criteria specified in BDS. c) in the case of a Bidder not doing business within Pakistan, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an Agent in Pakistan equipped, and able to carry out the Supplier's maintenance, repair, and spare parts-stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications. d) that the Bidder meets the qualification criteria listed in the Bid Data Sheet.
	13.4	The documentary evidence of conformity of the Information System to the Bidding Documents shall be in the form of

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		<p>written descriptions, literature, diagrams, certifications, and client references, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) the Bidder's technical bid, i.e., a detailed description of the Bidder's proposed technical solution conforming in all material aspects with the Technical Requirements and other parts of these Bidding Documents, overall as well as in regard to the essential technical and performance characteristics of each component making up the proposed Information System; b) an item-by-item commentary on the Procuring Agency's Technical Requirements, demonstrating the substantial responsiveness of the Information System offered to those requirements. In demonstrating responsiveness, the commentary shall include explicit cross references to the relevant pages in the supporting materials included in the bid. Whenever a discrepancy arises between the item-by-item commentary and any catalogs, technical specifications, or other preprinted materials submitted with the bid, the item-by-item commentary shall prevail; c) Preliminary Project Plan describing, among other things, the methods by which the Bidder will carry out its overall management and coordination responsibilities if awarded the Contract, and the human and other resources the Bidder proposes to use. 9. **Automated Root Cause Correlation:** The AI engine must automatically correlate high complaint density in a specific area with potential technical root causes by integrating multiple data sets, including: the last updated date of coverage maps, OSS data (on a separate tab), and recent reports (planned/unplanned outages, cable cuts, etc). This provides automated diagnostics for complaint disposal.

4. More options of "Polygon Selection" on maps to be explored like fixed radius selection, marquee selection, etc. This will help in analysis and in verifying blocking areas during network shutdown. Furthermore, the option of deselecting the polygon should also be added.

5. Option to upload and plot drive test results (RSRP, RSRQ and signals strength) values in CSV should be included. This should be overlaid on available prediction maps to develop correlation with coverage predictions.

6. Comprehensive Capacity enhancement of system to get rid of operational issues such as abrupt logouts/ Invalid credentials errors. For this querying capacity should be enhanced, which is currently capped at 10. This would enable simultaneous usage by multiple users.

7. Measurement Report (MR) Data for at least coverage/signal strength/RSRP/RSRQ may be sought from CMOs on quarterly basis and same be incorporated in portal.

8. Detailed BTS data including USF (Yes/No), power arrangement, backhaul arrangement (fiber/MW) should be made part of BTS data in the portal.

Coverage Prediction Validation: Implement ML algorithms to automatically compare and validate operator-supplied coverage predictions against crowdsourced data (like Ookla) and drive test results (RSRP, RSRQ, signal strength). The system must assign a confidence score or flag anomalies in operator submissions for verification.

11. Predictive Infrastructure Vulnerability Scoring: Implement an ML model that scores each BTS site based on its vulnerability to natural disasters (e.g., flooding). The scoring shall integrate BTS location and elevation data with detailed infrastructure parameters, specifically power arrangement and backhaul arrangement (fiber/MW), to predict the probability of site destruction or service outage during an incident.

- 11) **Infrastructure Expansion Simulation:** Provide a "what-if" simulation tool allowing users to hypothetically add BTS/OFC assets and evaluate resulting coverage and population impact.
- 12) **Scheduled & Automated Report Generation:** The system shall support scheduled generation and distribution of reports (weekly, monthly, quarterly) via email or internal dashboard.





1. Exceptions
